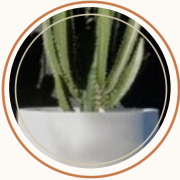
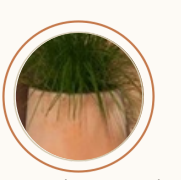
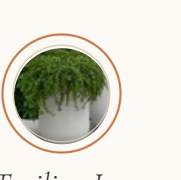


Laurus nobilis /Bay Laurel Tree

Formal shape and deep green foliage against white render and cream gravel.

01 Anchor with the large pot first.	02 Vary heights dramatically.	03 Mix rendered white with aged terracotta.	04 Let the small pot trail to the ground.
